

Many ABPA members will be saddened by the loss of fellow poet and friend Mr Johnny Johanson who passed away on 26th February at Yarrawonga. John's funeral was held on the 1st March and attended by friends and relatives.

Johnny Johanson, born in Fitzroy, Melbourne in 1934 at the tail end of the Great Depression and the beginning of the Second World War. Life was fairly tough in those days and like many Australians born in that era, he lived life hard gathering experience as he trudged the trails of hard knocks. He traveled down many of life's highways with plenty of side streets as well. Johnny had a very colourful and chequered like and took a lot of life's hurdles in his stride, a very private bloke in his latter years and not to comfortable in crowds. You could never miss that cheeky gleam in his eye and his fair dinkum, 'she'll be right mate' grin. Johnny could hold his head up high when it came to competitions at Winton and Tamworth or any other place he appeared. He could recite poems such as "The Old Master" by CJ Dennis or one of his own works about what it takes to be a true Aussie. That about sums up in a few words the character of Johnny Johanson... A True Blue Australian.... Just like CJ Dennis. Johnny wrote the way he talked and some of his verse was hard to decipher but if you forgot about the spelling and just concentrated on the lines, his verse was very down to earth and pleasant to read. From his award winning poem 'Just A Wife' to his tribute to Kathy Freeman, 'The Proud & The Prejudiced' or his cheeky 'One Fong The Swagman' and 'The Dinkum Aussie'. John's poetry was pure Australian.

John was a proud member of the ABPA, member of Kyabram & District and The Snowy River Mountains Bush Verse Groups. He leaves behind two sons and a daughter and many many friends.

"Rest in Peace Johnny".

Special celebrations were the order of the day at Tony and Miles Flanagan's "Elmslea Homestead" during this years Bungendore Country Muster. Always a serenely beautiful spot to perform, (The Poet's Breakfasts are held there annually), the year 2001 saw the dedication of the newly constructed "Elmslea Pavilion" a purpose built space and reception/function venue.

The challenge of writing and performing a new night show each year is a big one, but we were elated with the response from our fans and we look forward to doing the same again next year. The hits of the show was Bobby Miller's performance of "Once A Jolly Geisha" - Shirley Friend's "Underarm Hair Removal Tragedy" and Pat Drummond's "Marilyn Monroe Was A Size 14".

As well as the five night shows, and due to popular demand, we did four completely distinct "Naked Poet's Best Bits" lunch-time shows which also were filled to capacity and enticed a lot of "first timers" to a poetry/comedy venue. The addition of comedians Alan Glover and S Sorensen may have had some Poetry stalwarts up in arms, but we figured diversity maintains interest for both the audience and the performers. Who knows next year we may have a chainsaw juggler (if the bloody when'll start).

This year also saw The Naked Poet's receive two of the four awards at the Bush Laureate awards for The Best Album and Best Single Recorded Performance Of The Year for "The Other Home Bush Games". I would also take this opportunity to thank all those Poets and their families and friends who have supported us from our modest beginnings by manning doors, and just being there in general. We really do hope those of you who know the journey we have taken realise how much you are appreciated, and although it is often difficult to thank each helper personally, we offer talk of how lucky we are to receive both your assistance and mate ship.

It has been so exciting to see other shows like "Sex Lies & Poetry" getting off the ground and attracting strong audiences. If Poets begin to team and produce quality shows in quality venues, then the audience, all be it slowly at first, will come in quality numbers.

Man From Snowy River Bush Festival

The Legend of Jack Riley.

Irish born Jack Riley made his home in the Kosciusko Ranges on becoming manager of the Tom Groggin cattle station in 1884 and soon acquired a reputation as a skilled horseman and stockman.

In 1890 Banjo Patterson visited Jack's high country hut and spent a night with him while Jack told the story of a ride where he daringly pursued a thoroughbred station on horseback through the rough mountain country. That was the year that the Bulletin published "The Man From Snowy River" the famous poem which has since become part of Australia's history.

A Lost Moment in Time.

It was on December 23 - 1900 that an announcement was carried in *Perth* Morning Herald that one Mr. P.F. Pelly, or Major Pelly had died from the affects of poison, self administered, but taken by mistake. Major Pelly was reputed to be none other than the infamous or famous, which ever way you may view him, Captain Starlight. This notorious bushranger roamed and terrorised the area of Northern New South Wales and Queensland in the mid-1800's. Captain Starlight had an amazing history. He was convicted of murder, was sentenced to hang, had this changed to life imprisonment, and later in life after another prison term ended up in Western Australia. The book, "Robbery Under Arms" by *Rolf Boldrewood* immortalised Captain Starlight and although many were sure that "Pelly" was "Starlight", a great deal of mystery surrounded the man. But "Lost Moment in Time", remembers that the supposed "Starlight" died accidentally by his own hand, just 100 years ago last December.
